Keeping Our Children Safe on the Local Roads

It has been noted recently that parents are parking on the pavement outside school or ignoring the double yellow line markings. The Highway Code definition of parking on the pavements states that 'You MUST NOT park partially or wholly on the pavement in London, and should not do so elsewhere unless signs permit it. Parking on the pavement can obstruct and seriously inconvenience pedestrians, people in wheelchairs or with visual impairments and people with prams or pushchairs.' 
