#### Measuring the impact of Pupil Premium Grant spending

#### Early Years Foundation stage (EYFS)

66% of Pupil Premium children (2 out of 3 children) made expected progress in all learning goals and 33% of Pupil Premium children (1 out of 3 children) made expected progress in 14/17 learning goals.

# Key Stage 1 (KS1)

#### Overview

57% of Pupil Premium children (4 out of 7 children) made at least 4 APS progress within the year across KS1 in <u>writing</u>. (KS1 expected progress.) 29% (2 out of 7 children) made at least 6 APS (better than expected progress)

71% of Pupil Premium children (5 out of 7 children) made at least 4 APS progress within the year across KS1 in <u>reading</u>. (KS1 expected progress.) 43% (3 out of 7 children) made at least 6 APS (better than expected progress)

57% of Pupil Premium children (4 out of 7 children) made at least 4 APS progress within the year across KS1 in <u>maths</u>. (KS1 expected progress.) 29% (2 out of 7 children) made at least 6 APS (better than expected progress)

# Phonics – Year 1

33% of Pupil Premium children (1 out of 3 children) passed the Year 1 phonics screening check. 100% of Pupil Premium children made progress in phonics when checked from March to June.

# Year 2

#### Reading

75% of Pupil Premium children (3 out of 4 children) achieved a level 2+ 50% of Pupil Premium children (2 out of 4 children) achieved a level 2b+ 75% of Pupil Premium children made at least 4 APS progress within the year (KS1 expected progress.) 25% children made 8 APS progress (KS1 better than expected progress)

# Writing

100% of Pupil Premium children (4 out of 4 children) achieved a level 2+ 25% of Pupil Premium children (1 out of 4 children) a level 2b+ 50% of Pupil Premium children made at least 4 APS progress within the year (KS1 expected progress)

# <u>Maths</u>

95% of Pupil Premium children (19 out of 20 children) made at least 4 APS progress within the year across KS2 in <u>writing</u> (better than expected progress)
65% of Pupil Premium children (13 out of 20 children) made at least 4 APS progress within the year across KS2 in <u>maths</u> (better than expected progress)
