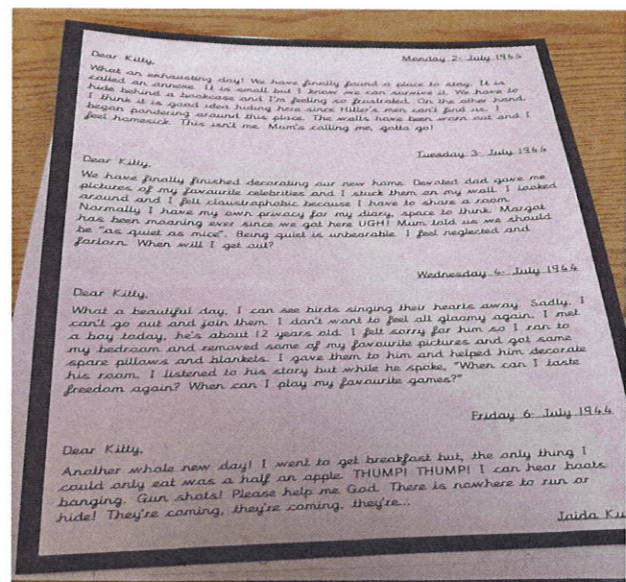
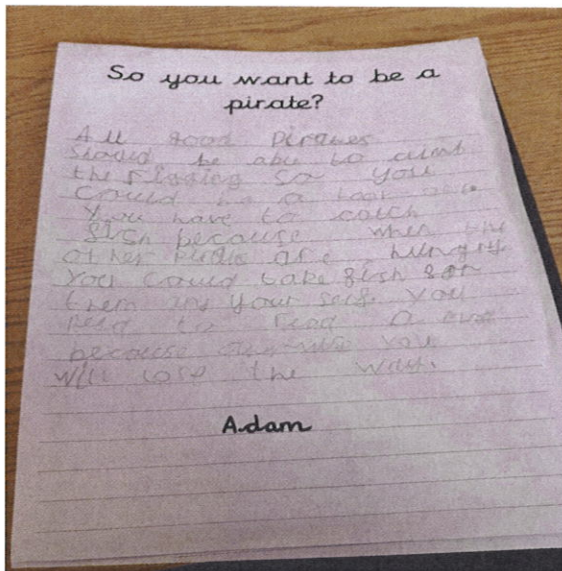


SUMMER TERM 2017 – Friday 29th September 2017
