Dear Parents and Carers,

This week the children of St Theresa's have been taking part in recognising Anti- Bullying Week. The aim of the week has been to raise the awareness of bullying of children and young people, in schools and elsewhere, and to highlight ways of preventing and responding to it. All the children have had the opportunity to design their own anti- bullying posters and have come up with some great slogans such as 'bullying, let's stamp it out' and 'be a buddy not a bully.' We were also lucky enough to have anti- bullying workshop performances for Key Stages 1 and 2. Key Stage 1 learnt the importance of being themselves and that it would be really rather boring if we were all exactly the same, so we should be happy that we are all very different. Key Stage 2 saw a performance about a girl who was a victim of bullying in her new school. The children all took away the message that they need to tell an adult when they feel that something is wrong and that they should believe in themselves and be thankful for being who they are. Thank you to Mrs Holland for organising all of the workshops. The children also all got to take part in the St Theresa's Anti Bullying questionnaire to show how we as a school deal with any incidents.

Last Friday, Year 5 Red had a visit from Hannah Brownlow from Barnet Museum. Both Year 5's have been testing out new resources for Hannah and the museum in relation to their learning about The Battle of Barnet. These resources will be put into a box, put together by the museum, in order to send to other schools who also want to learn about the battle. We will be sending Hannah some of our writing so that children in other schools can see what we have been doing. Hannah was delighted to meet the children, and commented on how they were "brimming with enthusiasm and knowledge" for the topic. Well done Year 5! They will soon be investigating some of the artefacts that have recently been found during the archaeological dig in Barnet.

On Wednesday Year 6 performed a terrific assembly based on their R.E topic of 'Justice'. The whole school was thrilled to welcome The Justice League to St Theresa's! Year 6 shared great people from history and the present day who did things to help spread the message of justice across the local and global community. The children read with clear voices and they performed their songs brilliantly. The children who performed their solo roles also deserve a special mention as they performed them so beautifully. 
