Reminders

To assist with the smooth running of the school and to enable me, the staff and pupils to achieve a successful working environment, I seek your full support with the following:-

Punctuality

The school day starts at 8:50am. The children must be in class ready to learn at this time. The school gates open at 8:30 to ensure you have a 20 minute window to get your child into school. Please take advantage of this opportunity as being late causes a lot of upset for the child and disruption for the rest of the class.

Gate for Year 1 and Year 3

Thank you to the parents who are leading their children to the side gate and allowing them to walk alone to their classroom door. Four classes use this pathway. When it is filled with adults the children don't have room to walk up the path and it can be intimidating if it is filled with adults they don't know! If you would like to speak to your child's teacher in the morning — even if it's to let them know your child didn't sleep well or were a bit tearful in the morning please let the secretaries know. They will always pass the message on to the teacher.

In the interests of safety the teachers must supervise and give their full attention to the children in the morning and cannot speak to parents on an individual basis.

KS2 – End of the day arrangements

For Year 5 and Year 6 especially, please collect your child from the playground as opposed to the classroom door. It is very difficult for the teacher to maintain the safety of the class when children are taken from the line walking to the playground without notice.

Uniform, Coats & Bags

The children have come back to school in their very smart uniform which is a huge credit to you as parents. Unfortunately I have found brand new sweaters and jumpers with no name on at all! This is such a shame as I know they are not the cheapest of items to buy. Please label your child's clothes even if it's with a biro. It will eventually make its way back to the owner.

As the weather becomes slightly colder please ensure your child has a navy coat to wear to school. I have resisted from insisting each child wears the navy school coat from the uniform suppliers as, on the whole, navy coats are worn. Please support us in making sure the navy colour and the smart uniform is consistent throughout the school. Last year we had many compliments from people who saw our children on school trips. Smart uniform ensures a smart mind! I would also encourage KS2 parents to buy the school rucksacks. If not a dark coloured bag would be suitable. KS1 children must have St Theresas book bags.

<u>Playground equipment – Sainsburys</u>

Each class has their own clearly labelled basket with skipping ropes hoops, balls and bats.
