Parent consultations

Car Park

Unfortunately the school car park is not big enough for parents to park in and is reserved for the use of staff only. Staff enter and exit the car park early in the morning or in the evening when children are not around. Recently there have been a few incidences where parents have opened the closed gates and driven in to park in the car park. Please do not use the school car park when collecting your child from afterschool clubs or picking up/dropping off your child. It is strictly for staff use only. Thank you.

Morning Procedure

There still seems to be some misunderstanding with our morning procedure, which has led to some classes being disrupted by parents and which potentially could lead to safety issues. We must insist that you follow the following procedures:

Year 1 Red and Blue– please say goodbye to your children at the side gate allowing them to walk the short distance to their classroom by themselves.

Year 2 – please say goodbye to your children at the bottom of the ramp – Do not go up the ramp or into the classroom.

Year 3 & 4 -please say goodbye to your children at the side gate allowing them to walk the short distance to their classroom by themselves.

Year 5 & 6 – please say goodbye to your children in the playground.

Reception – parents can enter the classroom up until half-term if necessary, but should aim to say goodbye to their children at the Reception gate.

Communication is extremely important between parents and teachers and we encourage you to build a good relationship with your class teacher, teaching assistants, Miss Kelly, the office and myself. However, this cannot be to the detriment of safety or teaching and learning. Teachers are happy to meet with parents in the morning or after school by appointment and are generally always available after school for a short discussion. If you have a message for the teacher in the morning please write a short note, send an email or speak to the office.

These procedures are in place purely and solely for the safety, security and development of your children. Please help us by following them.
