priesthood.

He was ordained a priest and within a few years, a bishop.

Patrick chose to return to Ireland. His first convert gave Patrick a barn where the first church was built at <u>Saul</u>, County Down.

Patrick travelled throughout Ireland, converting people to Christianity. He used the shamrock leaf to tell people about the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Three persons in one God, the Holy Trinity.
