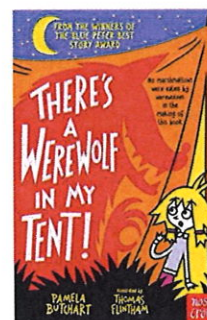
St Philip's Parish Centenary

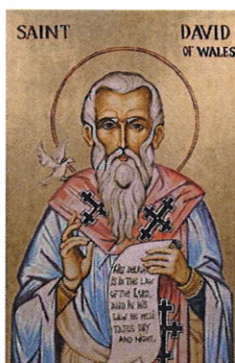
