### **Year 6 Secondary Transfer Information**

This week, all Year 6 parents should have received an email from the school office with information regarding the process of applying for a secondary school place for your Year 6 child.

Due to COVID-19 it is possible that the scheduled open evenings will not go ahead and therefore parents are strongly advised to check school websites before attending any events.

The online application system is now open at www.eadmissions.org.uk

All parents must apply online. If you need support please feel free to contact the school for support, or call the School Admissions Customer Services Team on 020 8359 7651.

Parents of children in Y6 who have an Educational Health Care Plan will need to complete a different form – this will be sent to you by the Barnet SEN team.

Many schools have delayed their selection test dates due to COVID-19, which means you may not get the results of tests until after 31<sup>st</sup> October. Where a test result might affect the outcome of an application, parents will be able to change their preferences up until 10<sup>th</sup> December.
