Dear Parents and Carers,

Yesterday I emailed parents the latest government guidance around the new national restrictions; if you did not receive the email you can read it on the school website here: https://www.st-theresas.barnet.sch.uk/wp-content/uploads/2020/11/New-National-Restrictions-5th-November-2020.pdf

The school is remaining open throughout the lockdown; breakfast club and Little Saints after school club will operate as normal (since their primary purpose is to provide childcare) but all other after school clubs are cancelled until further notice.

Now that we are officially under the new restrictions it is even more important that all parents follow the social distancing guidelines on the school grounds. We are still concerned that not all adults are moving on quickly enough after drop off and pick up, and that the path around the school building is becoming crowded. Please remember to wear a face mask/covering - if social distancing cannot be maintained - and show consideration for other parents. Please also bear in mind that some adults are exempt from wearing face masks for a range of reasons which may not be apparent.

The class teachers have completed their first round of parent phone consultations and will speak to the remaining parents next week. On the date you have been allocated, between 4pm-6.30pm you will receive a 10 minute phone-call from the class teacher. The teacher will phone the 1st emergency mobile contact number that we hold for your child. If this is not the appropriate number, please contact the class teacher.

Thank you to everyone who supported the Pumpkin Carving Competition; Mr Troy and I really had fun looking at all the photos. I am amazed at how diverse and imaginative the carvings were. Congratulations to Avash from Y2 and Margaret from Y5 who were the winners and a huge thank you to the Friends for organising the competition.

Staying Safe Reminder for Pupils

8 ways to be safe while walking to school

- When crossing roads, look both ways and use zebra crossings.
- Never assume drivers can see you. Be alert and make eye contact with the driver.
- Look left, right and left again before crossing the street.
- Eyes up, phones down.
- Walk on pavements or paths.
- · Cross with an adult.
- Be a good role model.
- · Be visible.

- Never stop to talk to anyone on the way to school or going home from school.
- Ignore any drivers who might slow down to speak to you.
- Never accept a ride from anyone that is not expected to take you home.
- Always tell a trusted adult if something has happened that upsets you or makes you feel uncomfortable.

Symptoms of Covid-19

If your child has any of the main symptoms of coronavirus they will need to get a test as soon as possible. Main symptoms:

- A high temperature
- A new continuous cough
- A loss or change to their sense of smell or taste Your child will need to stay at home until the test result is received.

Everyone in the household and support bubble will also need to stay at home until the test results are received.

Remember 'Hands. Face. Space.'

Hands: Wash your hands regularly and for 20 seconds

Face: Wear a face covering in indoor settings where social distancing may be difficult, and where you will come into contact with people you do not normally meet

Space: Stay 2 metres apart from people you do not live with where possible, or 1 metre with extra precautions in place (such as wearing face coverings or increasing ventilation indoors)
