#### **Dear Parents and Carers,**

Attached to the bottom of this week's newsletter is information regarding how and when to notify the school should your child test positive for COVID-19 during the Christmas holidays. Parents must read this information and follow the guidelines.

I know some families are travelling abroad over Christmas; if you are having to travel abroad over the holiday, you will need to follow the rules for entering the UK when you return. Depending on the country you are travelling from, you may need to isolate for the first 10 days you are back in the UK. We ask all families to follow the government guidelines re. self-isolating; this is to ensure all members of the school community (the children, the staff and the parents) are protected. Do not send your child to school if you have been requested to isolate following a trip abroad. COVID-19 isolation related absences during term-time are authorised by the school - family holidays are not. Therefore if a family returns to the UK from abroad before the start of term, but then has to isolate during school time, the absence will be authorised. If, however, a family returns to the UK on Wednesday 6th January for example (when school has already started) and then isolates for the following 10 days, the absence on Tuesday 5th and Wednesday 6th January will be unauthorised (and a fine may be issued) because the family were on holiday when the school was open - but the period of isolation after will be authorised. Please do contact the school if you have any questions about this.

Thank you to the everyone who supported the Christmas Jumper day - we raised £90. The money will be given to *Save the Children*. Save the Children is a global charity working in over 100 countries giving children a healthy start in life, the opportunity to learn and protection from harm.

The children enjoyed their Christmas lunch and, of course, their parties this week. Christmas at school this year however has been quite different; no carol concerts, no nativity plays and no whole school Christmas lunch in the hall! Throughout this extraordinary time the children, staff and parents have been brilliant models of flexibility and understanding – thank you everyone for all of your support during this very difficult term. We pray that the new year brings us all more stability and a hope of a return to our 'normal' lives.

#### **Applications for Reception and Nursery**

#### **Symptoms of Covid-19**

If your child has any of the main symptoms of coronavirus they will need to get a test as soon as possible.

Main symptoms:

- A high temperature
- A new continuous cough
- A loss or change to their sense of smell or taste Your child will need to stay at home until the test result is received.

Everyone in the household and support bubble will also need to stay at home until the test results are received.

#### Remember 'Hands. Face. Space.'

**Hands:** Wash your hands regularly and for 20 seconds

**Face:** Wear a face covering in indoor settings where social distancing may be difficult, and where you will come into contact with people you do not normally meet

**Space:** Stay 2 metres apart from people you do not live with where possible, or 1 metre with extra precautions in place (such as wearing face coverings or increasing ventilation indoors)

## Information for Parents regarding COVID19 Contact Tracing over the Christmas Holiday period

Dear Parents and Carers,

I am writing to clarify the expectations around reporting cases of COVID19 and undertaking contact tracing over the Christmas holiday period.

As you know schools have played a vital role in reducing the spread of COVID19 over the last 9 months. One way in which they have done this is by undertaking contact tracing on behalf of the London Contact Tracing team. They identify and contact any individuals who have been in close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID19, during the time that is considered the contagious period. This is from 2 days before the person's symptoms are displayed. Those individuals are then required to self-isolate for 14 days because they are at risk of having contracted COVID19.

This contact tracing will not be taking place in the usual way during the Christmas break when schools are closed and there is less chance of school-based contacts existing.

Please follow the guidance below if your child begins to show symptoms of COVID19 during the Christmas break.

If your child develops symptoms of COVID19 within 48 hours of being in school you must seek a test for your child and the household must isolate at home until the test result is returned. You should let the school know that this has occurred. Please email office@sttheresas.barnetmail.net

The quickest way to obtain a test is to book a test at your local testing centre via <a href="https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test">https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test</a>.

If the test result is positive for COVID19, you must inform the school (email: **office@sttheresas.barnetmail.net**), and we will identify if there are any other individuals within the school community who are impacted by this.

If you are contacted by the school and your child is identified as a close contact of someone who has tested positive for COVID19, she/he must self-isolate for 14 days.

If the test result is negative, you should inform the school and you do not need to take any further action.

If your child develops symptoms of COVID19 <u>more than 48 hours</u> after their last day in school you must seek a test for your child and the household must isolate at home until the test result is returned.

If the test result is positive for COVID-19, having developed symptoms more than 48 hours since being in school, (Monday 21<sup>st</sup> Dec onwards) you must contact NHS Test and Trace and follow the advice given by them: <a href="www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/testing-and-tracing/">www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/testing-and-tracing/</a>

You should contact the school regarding absence in time for the first day of the new term.

If the test result is negative, you do not need to take any further action.

I would encourage you to adhere to social distancing and all COVID19 social mixing guidance for the remainder of term to reduce the risk of transmission of the virus as the last thing we want is anyone being unwell or required to self-isolate over the holiday period.
