Asymptomatic Testing for Parents and adults in households with Children at School

Parents and other adults in households with children at school or college, who do not have symptoms, can now access regular, rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing. This includes childcare and support bubbles. Here are the different ways for a household, childcare or support bubble to collect their test:

- Through your employer if they offer testing to employees.
 - o Contact your employer to find out more.
- At a local test site.
 - o To find your nearest test site visit https://maps.testand-trace.nhs.uk/.
- By collecting a home test kit from a test site.
 - O You can collect 2 packs of home test kits at a local collection point. Each pack contains 7 tests.
 - o Anyone 18 or over can collect.
 - o Most collection points are open from 1.30pm to 7pm. You can check online if the location is open or busy before you go. You do not need to make an appointment.
 - o Do not visit a collection point outside opening hours, as it may be used to test people with coronavirus symptoms outside these times.
 - o To find your nearest home test kit collection point visit https://find-covid-19-rapid-test-sites.maps.testand-trace.nhs.uk/findatestcenter.html
- By ordering a home test kit online.
 - If you cannot get tested at your workplace, or are unable to go to a test site or collect test kits, you can order a home test kit online.
 - Do not order online if you can get a test through other methods. This frees up home delivery for those who need it most.
