# **AUTUMN TERM 2021**

## Dear Parents and Carers.

Thank you to everybody who donated food for the school Harvest Festival on Wednesday. The children learnt about how important it is to take care of our planet to ensure it can continue to provide us with our food. Next week we will be delivering all your donations to the local Finchley Food Bank. On Monday, a representative from CAFOD (Catholic Agency for Overseas Development) will be following up our Harvest Festival by coming to talk to the children about the work CAFOD is currently doing to support farmers around the world.

This week in assembly, the children learnt that Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> October was World Mental Health Day. The children watched a short video (created by the Anna Freud National Centre for Children and Families) entitled "Talking Mental Health"; the video helps children understand what mental health is and the difference between every day small feelings and a big feeling that stops us from doing the every day things we enjoy.

On Wednesday, the Year 5 children thoroughly enjoyed their Egyptian workshop. They explored the ancient Egyptian lifestyle and learnt about the mummification process. They also roleplayed what life might have been like being ruled by the Pharaoh!

Next Tuesday (19th October) we have our second Parent Consultations in the hall; by now, all parents will have received their appointment times. When you arrive for your appointment, we will ask you to wait in the Y3 or Y4 classroom until the class teacher is ready to see you.

The children are really looking forward to the Halloween Disco next week and I am sure you have been busy getting costumes ready. Now that Test and Trace is being dealt with entirely by the NHS, the school is no longer responsible for informing parents of positive COVID cases. There have been a number of confirmed COVID cases in the school over the past few weeks (although not enough to hit the threshold for further action) and with this in mind we have decided that it would be sensible to take precautions for the Halloween Disco. For this reason, the disco will only be open to the children who currently attend the school; it is with regret that siblings or cousins who are not on roll, will not be able to come to the disco. We hope that, whilst this may be disappointing, parents will understand the reasons this decision has been made, and we thank you for your support.

On Monday (8<sup>th</sup> November) at 3.45pm we are inviting all the Y4 parents to a meeting regarding the national Multiplication Tables Check (MTC) for all pupils in Y4 which will be taking place in June 2022. We will be discussing how the test will be administered and what you can do to support your child at home. Y3 parents are also very welcome to attend. The Y3 and Y4 pupils may stay for the meeting, but must remain seated and quiet.

## The Wednesday Word

It is natural to want to be great. In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus teaches the disciples how to be truly great. Being kind, self-giving, thoughtful and helpful are great qualities. It's not always easy to live our lives in this way but it is the way that God wants us to live, to become the best that we can be. Ask your child what the word 'greatness' means to them. Who does your child know at home, at school or in the community who shows true greatness by putting others' needs first? It may help your child if you tell them about someone you know to be 'great'.

God is great and He made us to be great too. Through spending lots of his time serving others, Jesus shows us the way to true greatness. Each of you at home can share one thing about other family members which you think makes them great. Then choose a way in which you can be 'great' for each other this week. **Black History Month** 

October is Black History Month in the UK, an event that has been celebrated nationwide for more than 30 years. The month was originally founded to recognise the contributions that people of African and Caribbean backgrounds have made to the UK over many generations. Now, Black History Month has expanded to include the history of not just African and Caribbean people but black people in general. To celebrate Black History Month this month, the children are

being introduced to a variety of different black history heroes. Year 6 have been practicing a recital of the poem "Britain" written by Benjamin Zephaniah. Dr Benjamin Obadiah Iqbal Zephaniah, a musician, writer and poet, was born and raised in Birmingham; his poetry is strongly influenced by the music and poetry of Jamaica. Mr Troy uploaded a video of Year 6 reciting the poem on the school Twitter feed (it was a very early attempt!) and we are delighted that Benjamin Zephaniah himself has seen the video and commented on it.

The Year 5 pupils have been learning about the hidden black figures in the world of mathematics and have been looking at the work of Dr Nira Chamberlain. Nira Chamberlain campaigns for more diversity within the mathematical sciences and has also commented on the school Twitter feed.
