#### Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you to everybody who supported the Macmillan coffee morning last Friday; the school raised a very impressive £375.32!! We would like to especially thank Mrs Gibson for running the whole event for our school community.

Unfortunately, the school is receiving complaints from local residents of parents parking across their drives. Please park with consideration; not doing so can put the school's good name at risk.

Another reminder that on Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> October, we will be celebrating Harvest at school and are therefore appealing for food donations (tins, jars or dried food) which will all be given to the local Finchley Food Bank; any donations of toiletries are also welcome. Please ensure all food is unopened, in date and in its original packaging. Please drop off any donations, at the school office.

Please note that once the morning bell has been rung at 8.40am, we ask that all parents and children make their way to their classrooms; lessons start promptly at 8.50am. Once your child has entered their classroom, parents need to walk around the school building to exit. The side gates are locked at 8.55am; if your child arrives after this time, they will need to enter the school by the office entrance.

At this time of year, the local secondary schools are hosting their open days for prospective parents and we understand that Year 6 pupils will be visiting schools or sitting entrance exams in preparation for their applications to Year 7. The school is happy to support this and will authorise these absences for the Year 6 pupils. However, the school asks that any Year 5 parents, who are starting to think about secondary schools, visit the schools out of school time; we will no longer be authorising absences of this nature for our Year 5 pupils.

A reminder for our Y4 pupils that on Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> October, they will be participating in a TT Rockstar Day! All children in Y4 may come to school dressed as a rock star on that day – the rockier, the better!

#### **Drop-Off and Pick-Up Routines**

The pedestrian gate will open at 8.30am.

You and your children may walk down the path straight into the playground.

You may wait in the playground until 8.40am.

At 8.40am, a member of staff will ring the bell and your child may then access their classroom.

Parents are then asked to walk all the way around the back of the school building, to exit the premises.

Children (and adults) should not be riding their scooters in the playground.

At home-time, parents and carers are again asked to use the pedestrian path to enter the playground. You may wait in the playground. At 3.30pm the class teachers will dismiss their children directly to parents from the classroom doors. Please refrain from waving through the windows, or distracting your child at the end of the day when the teacher is still addressing the class.

Please do not use the car park as a pedestrian route.
