Dear Parents and Carers.

It has been a very busy week with the children out and about on various educational visits. Last Friday the Y2 pupils visited Stephens House and Gardens for a morning of planting and hunting for flowers and leaves. On Wednesday, the Y4 pupils went to the Museum of London to enhance their learning on the Romans. As this newsletter goes out to parents, the Year 6 pupils will be enjoying their day out at the Natural History Museum. A huge thank you to all the staff who arranged the trips and the parent volunteers who accompanied the pupils; we would not be able to provide these experiences for your children without your help.

Yesterday evening was the Halloween Disco and it was wonderful to have an opportunity for the school community to finally gather. There was a huge turnout and it was clear that the children - and families – had a great evening. A huge thank you to the Friends for organising this event and to all the volunteers who supported the evening.

You will see that we have now added all the Christmas events to the "Dates for your diary" section on the back of the newsletter. Historically, at St. Theresa's, all the classes have performed something at Christmas for the parents. Our school has unfortunately - only one hall which doubles up as a dining room. The hall space is used all day on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays for PE and cannot be used by the children immediately after lunch until the floor has been cleaned. This has a significant impact on rehearsal times for the classes when preparing for any type of performance. Therefore, from this year onwards, the Christmas Story will be performed by the Y1 and Y2 pupils and the Y5 pupils will host the Christmas carol concert. The Y3 and Y4 pupils will perform the Easter Story in the Spring term and the Y6 pupils will perform the end of year production in the Summer term. The Reception pupils will also have a end of year celebration for the parents at the end of the summer term.

A reminder that on Monday (8th November) at 3.45pm we are inviting all the Y4 parents to a meeting regarding the national Multiplication Tables Check (MTC) for all pupils in Y4 which will be taking place in June 2022. Y3 parents are also very welcome to attend. The Y3 and Y4 pupils may stay for the meeting, but must remain seated and quiet.

On Tuesday 16th November in the school hall 3.45pm-4.30pm, Helen Cheung be holding a "Teaching of Phonics" meeting for the Reception, Y1 and Y2 parents. Helen has provided consultancy support for National Projects including the National Oracy Project, The National Literacy Project, and the Communication, Language and Literacy Programme; she currently works as an Early Years Consultant for Barnet. Helen will be explaining how phonics is taught and how parents can support their children at home. We are strongly encouraging all infant parents to attend this meeting; children's phonic knowledge is the basis of their reading and writing skills. A crêche will be available for parents who have young children. If your child stays in the hall, it will be your responsibility to ensure they remain seated and quiet for the duration of the meeting.

The Wednesday Word

Ask your child what the word 'courage' means to them. When was the last time they needed courage? Have they ever needed the courage to: go somewhere new or try something new; tell the truth; admit a mistake; stand up for someone; speak up for something that was right; resist peer pressure or go against the crowd and say that something was wrong? Is there anything they are afraid of right now? Who do they know who has shown courage or shows courage?

The word 'courage' comes from the Latin word for 'heart' and it
basically means that you are brave. Courage is a gift of the Holy Spirit
– it makes us strong. Putting our faith in Jesus ad his teachings gives
us the courage to do the right thing. We can try to remember this
Sunday's Gospel and ask Jesus to help us whenever we need courage.
How can we have more courage? Perhaps we can: pray to God for
more courage; support and encourage each other always to do what
we know to be right – even if we are afraid.

Young Interpeters

The Young Interpreter Scheme® recognises the huge potential that exists within each school community for pupils of all ages to use their skills and knowledge to support new learners of English so that they feel safe, settled and valued from the start. Young Interpreters (YI) undergo specific training to prepare for this role and are selected on the basis of different personal qualities they may have. The support they can offer to a newly-arrived pupil can be very reassuring from a parent or carer's point of view at a time when their child may be adapting to substantial changes. It also supports school staff in a variety of ways at different points during the school day.

We have 13 YIs who have all been creating posters celebrating their language and sharing helpful information to new students

of the school. They have all been issued with YI badges and pencils as part of their role and once they have completed their training will be awarded certificates.
