Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you to everybody for supporting the Travelling Book Fair this week. We will let you know how much was raised for the school when we have been given the total. A thank you also to everyone for supporting the Friends' Movie Nights – there were a large number of children at both events. We will let you know how much was raised when we have the final figures.

A reminder that on Monday 29th November 3.45-4.30pm, in the hall, Mr Troy will be delivering a maths Fractions Workshop for our infant parents. Mr Troy will be sharing tips on how parents can support their children with their maths learning at home. On Monday 6th December, 3.45-4.30pm, Mr Troy will be holding a similar workshop for our junior parents on the teaching of fractions; I am sure that any parent with children who have gone through KS2 (Y3-Y6), knows how difficult learning about fractions can be! A crêche will be available (for both meetings) for parents who have young children. If your child stays in the hall, it will be your responsibility to ensure they remain seated and quiet for the duration of the meeting.

Monday 29th November is the last day for parents to make any comments on the draft Behaviour Policy. The draft policy was emailed to all parents on Monday 15th November; please read the draft policy and if you would like to make any comments please do so by emailing the school office (email: office@sttheresas.barnetmail.net) with the subject heading School Behaviour Policy by Monday 29th November.

Parents may be aware that we are redeveloping the Reception outside area. Over the summer holidays, the first stage of the project was completed and some of the tarmac was laid down. The next stage is to replace the existing canopy, the 3rd stage is to re-tarmac the whole area and the final stage of the project is to install new fixed climbing equipment. We have been informed that the second stage of the project (replacing the canopy) will commence early Monday morning. Since the contractors will need access to the Reception outside area, parents will need to walk the other way to drop their children off (i.e. turn right at the bottom of the carpark). On Monday, Y6, Y5, and Reception pupils will enter and be dismissed via the hall doors. Y6, Y5 and Reception parents will need to drop off and pick up their children at the hall doors. Year 1 parents will need to use the side door to drop off and pick up. Parents will not be permitted entry to the playground. As the work continues, these arrangements may be amended and we will keep parents updated. The children will still be using the playground for playtimes but the Reception outdoor area will be out of use until the canopy has been replaced.

Safeguarding at St.Theresa's

A reminder to all parents that if you have any concerns about the safety of your child, or the safety of another child you can call the National Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children (NSPCC) for support and advice on 0808 800 5000. Alternatively, parents can ring the Barnet Multi Agency Safeguarding Hub on 020 8359 4066 or speak to the school.

Miss Barbara Costa is the Designated Safeguarding Lead at the school; Mr James Troy and Miss Barbara Folan are members of the safeguarding team. However, Safeguarding and Child Protection at St. Theresa's is EVERYONE'S responsibility and is taken extremely seriously.

What is bullying?

Bullying is behaviour that hurts someone else. It includes name calling, hitting, pushing, spreading rumours, threatening or undermining someone. It can happen anywhere – at school, at home or online. It's usually repeated over a long period of time and can hurt a child both physically and emotionally. If you think your child is being bullied, please speak to your child's class teacher.

St. Theresa's COVID-19 Update

Dear Parents,

We have a rising number of suspected COVID-19 cases in the school and we are therefore asking parents to please take extra precautions when sending their child/ren to school.

Routine Lateral Flow Tests

Whilst all children under the age of 11 are not required to routinely test for COVID-19, we are strongly recommending all parents carry out lateral flow tests twice a week on their children. You can order rapid lateral flow home test kits here: https://www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests. Or you can get up to 2 packs of 7 rapid tests from a local pharmacy; please visit https://test-for-coronavirus.service.gov.uk/collect-lateral-flow-kits for further information.

If the lateral flow test result is negative, your child can continue with their normal daily activities.

If your child gets a positive lateral flow test result – you must then get book a PCR test immediately to confirm the result. Your child should stay at home and not have visitors (self-isolate) until you get the PCR test result – they can only leave home to have the test. Please visit https://self-referral.test-for-coronavirus.service.gov.uk/antigen/essential-worker for further information on how to book a PCR test. We do not recommend postal test as these take longer for the results to arrive – and we are advising parents use the walk-in test centres wherever possible.

If the PCR test result is negative your child can continue with their normal daily activities.

If the PCR test is positive your child will need to self-isolate until the date specified by the Test and Trace team - who will contact you following the positive test result.

If your child has symptoms – PCR tests

If your child has any of the following symptoms DO NOT send your child into school and get a PCR test (not lateral flow) immediately:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot, for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- a loss or change to sense of smell or taste this means they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Your child should stay at home and not have visitors (self-isolate) until you get the PCR test result – they can only leave home to have the test. Please visit https://self-referral.test-for-coronavirus.service.gov.uk/antigen/essential-worker for further information on how to book a PCR test. We do not recommend postal test as these take longer for the results to arrive – and we are advising parents to use the walk-in test centres wherever possible.

If the PCR test result is negative your child can continue with their normal daily activities.

If the PCR test is positive your child will need to self-isolate until the date specified by the Test and Trace team - who will contact you following the positive test result.

If a member of your household tests positive for COVID-19

Children can still attend school if some-one in the household tests positive for COVID-19 however it is advised that everyone in the household takes a PCR test as a precaution and continues to take the lateral flow tests.
