Dear Parents and Carers,

A reminder that on Monday (8th November) at 3.45pm we are inviting all the Y4 parents to a meeting regarding the national Multiplication Tables Check (MTC) for all pupils in Y4 which will be taking place in June 2022. Y3 parents are also very welcome to attend. The Y3 and Y4 pupils may stay for the meeting, but must remain seated and quiet.

On Tuesday 16th November in the school hall 3.45pm-4.30pm, Helen Cheung be holding a "Teaching of Phonics" meeting for the Reception, Y1 and Y2 parents. Helen has provided consultancy support for National Projects including the National Oracy Project, The National Literacy Project, and the Communication, Language and Literacy Programme; she currently works as an Early Years Consultant for Barnet. Helen will be explaining how phonics is taught and how parents can support their children at home. We are strongly encouraging all infant parents to attend this meeting; children's phonic knowledge is the basis of their reading and writing skills. A crêche will be available for parents who have young children. If your child stays in the hall, it will be your responsibility to ensure they remain seated and quiet for the duration of the meeting.

Yesterday your child should have brought home the "Happy School Bag" collection bags. We ask that the bags are filled up with unwanted clothes (adult and children's clothing), paired shoes, fashion accessories, handbags, belts, hats, scarves and jewellery that are in good re-usable condition. Please bring the bags back to school at drop off time on Monday 22nd November. The pre-loved garments collected by Happy School Bag are sold to secondhand markets abroad for the purpose of reuse and provides affordable quality clothing to disadvantaged people in need. The Happy Bags company will weigh the items collected and donate 30p per kilo (current rate) to the school – the more we collect the more the school earns!

Next week, from 7.30am Monday 8th November to 7.30pm on Thursday 11th November, St. Theresa's will be competing in the TI Rockstars "England Rocks" tournament – a times table competition for all schools In England. The hours of play are 7.30am – 7.30pm and there is a daily 60-minute limit per player. Once a player goes beyond 60 minutes between 7.30am and 7.30pm on a given day they will no longer earn points towards the competition. Those 60 minutes do not need to be played in one block - they can be spread throughout the competition hour. The three highest scoring primary-age classes in England will win Amazon gift vouchers. 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All Saints and All Souls

In secular society, November is announced with a fanfare of pumpkins, skeletons, ghouls and ghosts. But the word 'Halloween' actually comes from the word 'hallowed' meaning 'blessed' or 'holy'.

'Hallowe'en' is actually a shortening of 'All Hallows' Eve.' Just like Christmas Eve is the day before Christmas, 'All Hallows' Eve' is the day before 'All Saints' Day' on the 1st November. And like how in Advent we prepare ourselves for Jesus' coming at Christmas, on All Hallows' Eve Christians often prepare by praying or fasting, and worshiping God. This week, we celebrated the Feasts of All Saints and All Souls. These two special days remind us that God has a special plan for everyone: to live with Him forever and be part of His special family called the Communion of Saints.

Young Interpeters

The Young Interpreter Scheme® recognises the huge potential that exists within each school community for pupils of all ages to use their skills and knowledge to support new learners of English so that they feel safe, settled and valued from the start. Young Interpreters (YI) undergo specific training to prepare for this role and are selected on the basis of different personal qualities they may have. The support they can offer to a newly-arrived pupil can be very reassuring from a parent or carer's point of view at a time when their child may be adapting to substantial changes. It also supports school staff in a variety of ways at different points during the school day. We have 13 YIs who have all been creating posters celebrating their language and sharing helpful information to new students of the school.

They have all been issued with YI badges and pencils as part of their role and once they have completed their training will be awarded certificates.
