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#### Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you to the parents who attended the Education Child Protection Limited "Online Safety" workshop on Monday afternoon. We hope the parents who came found it useful. Congratulations to the Y5 parents who attended, as they have won the Y5 children a nonschool uniform day on Friday 25<sup>th</sup> March.

On Wednesday, a letter regarding the school's appeal to support the victims of the crisis in Ukraine, was sent to all families. If you would like to make a donation to the Disaster Emergency Committee (DEC) via the school, you can do so either through SchoolMoney (there is a minimum of £10 donation if you pay via SchoolMoney) or you can donate cash via the school office. All donations will need to be made by Wednesday 23rd March; the school will then forward the total amount to the DEC. As the season of Lent continues, the children have been learning about the Stations of the Cross. The stations began as a pilgrimage to Jerusalem, now people pray the stations in church. The Stations of the Cross are prayed during Lent as they tell the story of Jesus from being condemned to death to being buried. As part of their learning, the children in Years 3 to 6 have visited St. Phillip's Church to see the pictures of the stations in the church, and pray them.

The first of our parents' evenings takes place on Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> March (the second is Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> March). Next Friday (18th March) the school will be participating in Red Nose Day for Comic Relief. Since Comic Relief began in 1985, it has helped support over 100 million people across the UK and around the world. The charity works to improve mental health, create safe places for everyone, help children to survive and thrive, and work to help people to speak out and seek help to escape fear and discrimination.

From Monday 14<sup>th</sup> March, the children will be able to purchase a red nose from the school for  $\pounds1.50$  – should they wish to (the red noses have already been delivered to the school). Each child will only be able to purchase one red nose in the first instance, but may be able to purchase more if we have any red noses left over once everyone has had the opportunity to buy one. On Friday 18th March (Red Nose Day) the children may come to school dressed in red clothes (or wearing anything red) for a  $\pounds1$  donation.

# Living with COVID-19 - updated February 2022

#### Testing

The guidance for education staff and secondary school pupils to undertake twice weekly asymptomatic testing has been removed.

#### Self-Isolation

The legal requirement to self-isolate following a positive test has been removed. Adults and children who test positive will continue to be advised to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for at least 5 full days and then continue to follow the guidance until they have received 2 negative test results on consecutive days.

#### Contact tracing

From 24th February, routine contact tracing ended. Contacts are no longer required to self-isolate or advised to take daily tests.

#### Individuals who test positive for COVID-19

Pupils who test positive for COVID should not attend school. Parents will be advised to keep their child at home for 5 full days; the school reserves the right to refuse the pupil until they have had 5 full days at home.

#### Individuals with COVID-19 Symptoms

The main symptoms of COVID-19 are a recent onset of any of the following:

- a new continuous cough
- a high temperature

• a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell If you have any of these symptoms you should order a PCR test. You are advised to stay at home and avoid contact with other people while you are waiting for the test result. Other symptoms linked with COVID-19 include shortness of breath, fatigue, loss of appetite, muscle ache, sore throat, headache, stuffy or runny nose, diarrhoea, nausea and vomiting. Any of these symptoms may also have another cause.

#### Safer Behaviours

Individuals can still reduce the risk of catching and passing on COVID-19 by:

a. Getting vaccinated;

b. Letting fresh air in if meeting indoors, or meeting outside; c. Wearing a face covering in crowded and enclosed spaces, especially where you come into contact with people you do not usually meet, when rates of transmission are high;

d. Trying to stay at home if you are unwell;

e. Taking a test if you have COVID-19 symptoms, and staying at home and avoiding contact with other people if you test positive; and

f. Washing your hands and following advice to 'Catch it, Bin it, Kill it'.
