Dear Parents and Carers.

Thank you to everybody for supporting Red Nose Day last week; including all the money made from the sale of the red noses, we raised £345.87 – thank you!

Thank you also to those of you who contributed to the Disasters Emergency Committee's Ukraine Humanitarian Appeal; we raised £330.

This week at St. Theresa's, the children have been celebrating all things science. On Monday, KS1 were treated to a science exhibition by Dr Andrew Szydlo (a performance chemist and educator who travels the world teaching chemistry) and the children got to see a range of science experiments which left them amazed; there was lots of fire, bubbles and explosions in the hall and it was a perfect way to start our Science Week. Year 4 and 5 visited Christ College and took part in different science investigations. Year 4 looked at various science experiments focusing on static electric energy. They got to use a huge Van der Graaf generator that made their hair stand on end! They also looked at how they could pass static electricity onto each other by creating a human chain. Year 5 took part in a soundwave project – investigating how the differences in the pitch and volume of their voices changed the appearance of the soundwave created. On Wednesday, Year 5 and 6 visited the science labs in Bishop Douglass and used their science skills to become crime scene investigators. The children had to perform different science experiments to rule out potential suspects before finally revealing who they thought the culprit was. Thank you to Miss Georgious for organising all the activities for the children this week.

The government has updated its guidance for people who have tested positive for COVID; please see the 2^{nd} page of the newsletter for the updates. The changes are in red.

Next Thursday, the Friends are hosting a non-uniform day; all children can come to school not wearing school uniform for a £2 contribution towards the Friends' funds.

School Attendance

Term Time Holiday Requests

We have received some requests for leave of absence during school time. Please can we remind you that term time holiday requests will only be permitted in exceptional circumstances.

Please ensure your child is present the last day of the term and the first day of a new term.

Education Welfare Officer (EWO)

Please note that children are expected to attend school for at least 96% of the year. Attendance is regularly checked by the EWO who may fine parents for any unauthorised absence.

Living with COVID-19 - updated 22nd March 2022

Testing

The guidance for education staff and secondary school pupils to undertake twice weekly asymptomatic testing has been removed.

Contact tracing

From 24th February, routine contact tracing ended. Contacts are no longer required to self-isolate or advised to take daily tests.

Individuals who test positive for COVID-19

Pupils who test positive for COVID should not attend school. They should take an LFD test from 5 days after their symptoms started (or the day their test was taken if they did not have symptoms) followed by another one the next day. If both these tests results are negative, they can return to school, as long as they feel well enough to do so and do not have a temperature.

Parents will be advised to keep their child at home until they have 2 consecutive negative lateral flow tests; the school will ask you for evidence of the two negative results. The school still reserves the right to refuse the pupil until they have had 5 full days at home and two negative results.

Individuals with COVID-19 Symptoms

The main symptoms of COVID-19 are a recent onset of any of the following:

- a new continuous cough
- a high temperature
- a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell If you have any of these symptoms you should order a PCR test. You are advised to stay at home and avoid contact with other people while you are waiting for the test result. Other symptoms linked with COVID-19 include shortness of breath, fatigue, loss of appetite, muscle ache, sore throat, headache, stuffy or runny nose, diarrhoea, nausea and vomiting. Any of these symptoms may also have another cause.

Safer Behaviours

Individuals can still reduce the risk of catching and passing on COVID-19 by:

- a. Getting vaccinated;
- b. Letting fresh air in if meeting indoors, or meeting outside;
- c. Wearing a face covering in crowded and enclosed spaces, especially where you come into contact with people you do not usually meet, when rates of transmission are high;
- d. Trying to stay at home if you are unwell;
- e. Taking a test if you have COVID-19 symptoms, and staying at home and avoiding contact with other people if you test positive; and
- f. Washing your hands and following advice to 'Catch it, Bin it. Kill it'.
