A reminder to all parents that the government has updated its guidance for people with COVID-19 symptoms. To see the guidance in full, please click this link:



In summary, the list of symptoms has been extended to include:

- continuous cough
- high temperature, fever or chills
- loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell
- · shortness of breath
- unexplained tiredness, lack of energy
- muscle aches or pains that are not due to exercise
- not wanting to eat or not feeling hungry
- headache that is unusual or longer lasting than usual
- · sore throat, stuffy or runny nose
- · diarrhoea, feeling sick or being sick

If a child has a positive COVID test result, they should stay at home for **3 days** after they took the test. After 3 days, if they feel well enough, they can return to school. If a child has COVID symptoms and is not well enough to come to school, but has not taken a test, they should stay at home until they are well enough to return to school.

What was Peter's reply to Jesus' questions? What three things did Jesus tell Peter to do? Peter had denied knowing Jesus three times before the crucifixion. But now Jesus gives Peter the chance to say he loves him three times – preparing Peter to lead the Church. From this point onwards, St Peter's life witnessed to the truth about Jesus. Ask your child what the word 'witness' means to them. Who has recently brought the message of Jesus to your child? Who does your child know to be a great witness for Jesus?

St. Peter gave witness to what Jesus did and who Jesus really was. Because of his witness, many people came to know and follow Jesus. Through our words, actions and through the power of the Holy Spirit, we too can be God's witnesses, through living out lives the way Jesus shows us.
