Dear Parents and Carers.

Thank you to everybody who has already returned last week's forms; it is much appreciated. If you have not yet returned all the necessary paperwork, please do so at your earliest convenience.

We have had a great second week back. On Monday the Year 3 pupils had their first cornet lesson! This is part of a project led by Barnet Educational Arts Trust which aims to encourage young people to learn to play a musical instrument. The Year 3 pupils will have a further 9 lessons, finishing with a concert for the parents. We will let the Year 3 parents know the date of the performance in due course. On Wednesday, as part of their "Pirates" topic, the Y2 children visited The Golden Hinde - the first English ship to circumnavigate the Globe. They had a great time exploring the ship; thank you to all the staff and adults who accompanied the pupils and made this trip possible.

Next week, we are continuing to invite parents to the class curriculum meetings. School Lunches

Y3-Y6 Parents: your child could be entitled to free school meals

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Please speak to a member of the school office team if you think your child may be eligible for free school meals.

Reception, Yl and Y2 Parents

All children in Reception, Y1 and Y2 are offered school lunches free of charge, under the Government's Universal Infant School Lunch scheme. However, if you are in receipt of any of the benefits listed above, <u>please let the school know</u> because it might help the school claim for further funding. If successful, it could mean an extra £1385 per identified child. This additional funding is called the **Pupil Premium**. This extra funding is used by the school to fund many school activities.

Expectations in Reading, Writing and Maths

Year 6 Secondary Transfer Information

The online application system for our Year 6 parents is now open at www.eadmissions.org.uk

All parents must apply online. If you need support please feel free to contact the school for support, or call the School Admissions Customer Services Team on 020 8359 7651.

Parents of children in Y6 who have an Educational Health Care Plan will need to complete a different form – this will have been sent to you by the Barnet SEN team.

The deadline for submitting your application is Monday 31 st October 2022. Applications received after 31 st October will be treated as late. Late applications will not be considered until after the on-time applicants have been allocated their school places. This means that late applicants are unlikely to be offered one of their preferred schools. If there is a good reason as to why your application is late; for example the serious illness of a close relative, or you moved to the area after the closing date, you must submit a Reason for Late Application Form at www.barnet.gov.uk/schooladmissions by 9 December 2022 at the latest.
