
On Friday 20th October, we continue to support the Friends with a non-school uniform day. All children may come to school on that day in non-school uniform for a donation of $\pounds 1$.

All children are invited to join in with our non-school uniform day on Friday 21st October for a donation of £1. All money will go to the Friends of St. Theresa's who organise fun events for the children over the year.

In-School Mini London Marathon Challenge

St. Theresa's is participating in the In-School Mini London Marathon challenge.

The challenge is for children to run, jog or walk 2.6 miles in school by Friday 21st October; it can be done in one go or broken up into smaller chunks. It is to encourage our children to be active and healthy.

All participants will receive a free TCS Mini London Marathon pin.

School Attendance and Punctuality

Can I please remind all parents that the registers are marked by 8.50am and **close at 9:30am**. Attendance after the register closes (9.30am) will receive a mark to show that the child is on site, but it will count as an absent mark.

If no satisfactory reason is given for a pupil's late arrival to school (after 9.30am) this absence will be unauthorised. If a pupil has six unauthorised absences due to arriving after the register closes at 9.30am, in any four-week period, parents may be issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice (FPN).

The Wednesday Word

"Dear Parents, teach your children to pray. Pray with them. Prayer strengthens family life." Pope Francis

What was Jesus teaching his disciples? In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus tells us that God is not like the unjust judge who is irritated by the woman pestering him. No matter how much we pray to God, he doesn't think we are pestering him - he is our loving Father. There are many kinds of prayer. This Gospel reminds us about the value of 'Asking Prayer' and not giving up in our prayer requests. Ask your child what the word 'prayer' means to them. Does your child like to pray aloud or quietly, alone or with others? What is their favourite prayer?

"Prayer brings us not only nearer to God but also nearer to one another." Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI

Prayer, at its simplest, is spending time with God – talking, listening, being together – telling God all about our lives. We can trust that God always hears our prayers and will always do what is best for us and those we pray for. We can pray anywhere, anytime. Each of you say when and where you like to pray (e.g. at home, in bed, at church, at school, outside, elsewhere). What would you like to pray and ask God for this week? Who can you pray for throughout the coming week (e.g. a family member, a friend, your teacher, your priest, a poorly, hungry or lonely person)? How else can you help that person?

Year 6 Secondary Transfer Information

The online application system for our Year 6 parents is now open at www.eadmissions.org.uk

All parents must apply online. If you need support please feel free to contact the school for support, or call the School Admissions Customer Services Team on 020 8359 7651.

Parents of children in Y6 who have an Educational Health Care Plan will need to complete a different form – this will have been sent to you by the Barnet SEN team.

The deadline for submitting your application is Monday 31st October 2022. Applications received after 31st October will be treated as late. Late applications will not be considered until after the on-time applicants have been allocated their school places. This means that late applicants are unlikely to be offered one of their preferred schools. If there is a good reason as to why your application is late; for example the serious illness of a close relative, or you moved to the area after the closing date, you must submit a Reason for Late Application Form at www.barnet.gov.uk/schooladmissions by 9 December 2022 at the latest.
