Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been a very busy week here at St. Theresa's. Last Friday, Y5 went to the Charterhouse Museum to enhance their learning on the Tudors; they enjoyed a hands-on workshop. On Monday morning, our Y2 pupils took part in the Barnet Schools' Infant Music Festival and sang a selection of songs with other local primary schools at Tudor School. On Tuesday, the Y6 children went to London Zoo as part of their learning on Charles Darwin and his theory of Evolution. We would like to thank all the adult volunteers who supported these trips by helping to accompany the children.

A reminder to all parents that next Wednesday - 16th November - the school photographer is coming to take the children's individual photos. The staff will ensure siblings have their photos taken together.

On Wednesday (16th November) 3.30pm-5pm in the school hall, the Friends are holding the Infant Movie Night; all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are invited (the Junior movie night is the week after on Wednesday 23rd November). For £5, the children will watch "Minions: the Rise of the Gru" (certificate U) and be given a snack of crisps, sweets and biscuits. If you would like your child to attend, please ensure you complete and return the permission slips which were sent home to parents earlier this week. I hope that many children will be able to attend the event.

Over the past couple of months, the children in Y1-Y6 have been having weekly dance lessons with the Non-Stop Action dance teachers. Each class has been practising a choreographed routine and will be performing it to the rest of the school on Friday 25th November at 9am. All parents are warmly invited to attend this Dance Festival. The best routine (as chosen by myself and Mr Troy!) will go on to represent St. Theresa's at the Barnet Schools' Dance Festival in March.

A Fixed Penalty Notice costs £60 per parent and per child, if payment is made within 21 days. £120 if paid after the 21 days, but within 28 days. <u>Anti-Bullying Week</u> Sdd Socks Day - Monday 14th November



Anti-Bullying Week is taking place next week, Monday 14th – Friday 18th November and this year's theme is "Reach Out". It is co-ordinated by the Anti-Bullying Alliance, which is based at the National Children's Bureau. The theme "Reach Out" is a positive message about it always being possible to reach out and ask for help if you are worried about bullying.

Bullying affects millions of lives and can leave us feeling hopeless - but if we challenge it, we can change it and it starts by reaching out.

To mark the start of anti-bullying week we are inviting the children to come to school on Monday 14th November wearing odd socks. Odd Socks Day is about fun and laughter but more importantly, they deliver a message of individuality, acceptance and tolerance.

We will also be participating in the Odd Socks Day school competition by sharing a photo of the day on Twitter; the winning school will receive a visit and performance from Andy and the Odd Socks in 2023 – stars of the CBBC comedy drama Andy and the Band.

The Wednesday Word


