Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you to everybody for supporting Odd Socks Day on Monday – the start of Anti-Bullying Week. Anti-Bullying Week is an annual UK event, held in the third week of November which aims to raise awareness of bullying of children and young people, in schools and elsewhere, and to highlight ways of preventing and responding to it. Research shows that 30% of children have been bullied in the last year alone and 17% of children have been bullied online. If you are worried your child might be being bullied, please speak to your child's class teacher.

On Monday, the Mini Vinnies took all the Harvest Festival food donations to the Finchley Foodbank at St. Mary's Catholic Church. They spent time learning about how the foodbank is organised and where the donations come from; thank you to Mrs Maughan from the foodbank for spending time talking to the Mini Vinnies and answering all of their questions. An even bigger thank you to the parents who accompanied me and helped transport all the food – and the children – to and from the foodbank.

On Wednesday, the Friends hosted a very successful Movie Night for the infant children, thank you to everyone who supported the event. The children in Y3 to Y6 will be having their movie night on Wednesday (23rd November) 3.30pm-5pm. School Lunches

<u>Y3-Y6 Parents: your child could be entitled to free school meals</u> Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Please speak to a member of the school office team if you think your child may be eligible for free school meals.

Reception, Yl and Y2 Parents

All children in Reception, YI and Y2 are offered school lunches free of charge, under the Government's Universal Infant School Lunch scheme. However, if you are in receipt of any of the benefits listed above, <u>please let</u> <u>the school know</u> because it might help the school claim for further funding. If successful, it could mean an extra £1385 per identified child. This additional funding is called the **Pupil Premium**. This extra funding is used by the school to fund many school activities.

The Wednesday Word

"Read the gospels! This way we will learn what is most essential in our lives: love and mercy." *Pope Francis*

Mercy is a virtue. Ask your child what the word 'mercy' means to them. You may want to share with your child what the word 'mercy' means to you. Ask your child who they know to be a 'merciful' person. Can you or your child remember a time when you have been merciful – when you gave someone another chance? How did it feel?

"God is so merciful towards us. We too should learn to be merciful." *Pope Francis*

Each time we show 'mercy', we open o ourselves to receive mercy from God. Being compassionate, being patient with others even if we are being treated unfairly, forgiving others (even if we feel they don't deserve forgiveness), sometimes giving people more than they deserve, these are just some ways of showing mercy. Is there someone to whom you could show mercy? Each of you choose one way in which you will try to show mercy at home, at school or in the community in this coming week.

Miss Costa is the Designated Safeguarding Lead at the school; Mr Troy and Mrs Folan are members of the safeguarding team. However, safeguarding and child protection at St. Theresa's is everyone's responsibility and is taken extremely seriously.
