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# Dear Parents and Carers.

Thank you for all your support for last week's bubble show – the children loved stepping inside the huge bubbles; we raised £325!

Congratulations to the Year 5 pupils who represented St. Theresa's school at the Barnet Schools' Dance Festival at the Arts Depot on Tuesday evening. They performed a very uplifting routine to the song "Fame". Thank you to Miss Porcu for preparing the children for this event and all the adults who volunteered to accompany the children and looked after them throughout the course of the day.

On Tuesday, the Reception children visited Akiva School to learn about the festival of Purim. Purim is a Jewish holiday that celebrates the bravery of Queen Esther, the secretly Jewish wife of King Ahasuerus of Persia. The story is recounted in the Book of Esther and read in a special scroll called the Megillah. Our Reception pupils listened to the story, made shakers and were then given cookies to take home with them.

On Wednesday, pupils in Y1-Y4 had a workshop (On the Right Road) which taught the children all about road safety. A well done also to Katie (Y2), Emanuelle (Y4) and Evie (Y5) who won the road safety poster design competition.

Yesterday, a CAFOD (Catholic Agency for Overseas Development) speaker came to speak to the children about their Lenten appeal. This Lent, by contributing to the appeal, you can help families around the world to cope with the climate crisis. Communities are losing loved ones, their homes and their crops through no fault of their own. The people we serve are determined to adapt and they need your help now to get the tools and training they tell us they need. The children are bringing home the collection boxes today; if you want to make a contribution to this appeal, please ensure the box is returned to school by Friday 31st March (last day of term).

Today, British Science Week starts and to celebrate the event, the children are invited (if they wish to) to dress up on Monday (13<sup>th</sup> March) as something related to science. Topics can include; plants, animals (including humans), the weather, materials, space, rocks, magnets etc. dressing up is purely optional.

# St. Theresa's School Attendance Policy

Illnesses that will prevent your child from coming to school

- Vomiting and diarrhoea (your child can return to school 48 hours after the last episode)
- High temperature with a diagnosed infection
- Hospital admission
- Dental surgery
- Medical emergency

Illnesses that will not prevent your child from coming to school

- Mild cough
- Cold/Sneezes
- Tiredness

### Authorised and Unauthorised Absences

# Examples of authorised absences

- Proof of illness from GP/Hospital provided
- Phone call from parent / carer explaining that their child is ill
- Proof of medical appointment
- Permission given from Headteacher following a written request for exceptional leave of absence (i.e. Religious days etc.). All requests for exceptional leave of absence must be made in writing to the Headteacher. Request forms are available from the school office.

### Examples of unauthorised absences

- Holidays
- · Days out
- Birthdays
- Parent / carer or sibling unwell
- Tiredness
- No reasonable explanation received from parent / carer

Could parents/carers please ensure that any absence is reported to the school office by  $9\mathrm{am}.$ 


# St. Theresa's pupil attendance target for 2022-2023 is 96%

On Friday 17th March the school will be participating in Red Nose Day for Comic Relief. Since Comic Relief began in 1985, it has helped support over 100 million people across the UK and around the world. The charity works to improve mental health, create safe places for everyone, help children to survive and thrive, and work to help people to speak out and seek help to escape fear and discrimination.

On Friday 17th March (Red Nose Day) the children may come to school dressed in red clothes (or wearing anything red) for a £1 donation.

# The Wednesday Word

# **Bunny Hop Challenge** Monday 13th March



The children can use the next few days (before the bunny hop) to collect sponsorship pledges on their forms. There is no minimum or maximum amount - just what they can! They can either be sponsored per hop or an overall amount for the activity.

On Monday, the children need to come to school with their sponsorship form but it must be signed by their parent. Without a signed form they cannot jump and we don't want children to miss out.

The bunny hop will take place on Monday morning (13th March) and 4 children at one time will jump on the bouncy castle for a minute. They will each be spotted by an adult who has a clicker to record their hops. This number will be written on their forms.

They will return home on Monday with their forms and they can then collect sponsorship money which needs to be returned to school by 27th March.
