#### Dear Parents and Carers,

Last Friday our Y3 pupils enjoyed a river trip on the Thames followed by a visit to Leake Street Arches to see the street art as inspiration for their next art topic. Thank you to Mr Troy for organising this - and all the adults who accompanied the children.

On Monday, the children participated in the Bunny Hop challenge; they had to jump on a bouncy castle as many times as they could in 60 seconds. The child who jumped the most number of times, in each class, will win a prize; they will be told in the last week of term. A huge thank you to all the parents from the Friends Association who were involved in this and ran the event. A reminder to everyone that all sponsorship needs to be returned by Monday 27<sup>th</sup> March.

This week was science week and it started with an enjoyable dress up day; we had astronauts, doctors, surgeons, and we even had a plant! Over the course of the week, the children have been involved in various science activities. The Planetarium Show - which was supposed to take place on Monday - has been rescheduled for Wednesday 3rd May. The show has been designed to link perfectly with the Science National Curriculum. The children will learn amazing facts about the solar system and beyond, including taking a flying visit to (and learning information about) our incredible neighbouring planets. As part of the session, the workshop presenter will project the entire night sky onto the inside of a dome so that the children will be able to look at the beautiful stars and constellations in the night sky. The presenter will explain how to identify certain stars and constellations and also tell some magical stories dating back to the times of the Ancient Greek mythology. Thank you to Miss Georgious (the school Science Leader) who organised the science events for the school.

#### St. Theresa's School Attendance Policy

Illnesses that will prevent your child from coming to school

- Vomiting and diarrhoea (your child can return to school 48 hours after the last episode)
- High temperature with a diagnosed infection
- Hospital admission
- Dental surgery
- Medical emergency
- Illnesses that will not prevent your child from coming to school
- Mild cough
- Cold/Sneezes
- Tiredness

#### Authorised and Unauthorised Absences

#### Examples of authorised absences

- Proof of illness from GP/Hospital provided
- Phone call from parent / carer explaining that their child is ill
- Proof of medical appointment
- Permission given from Headteacher following a written request for exceptional leave of absence (i.e. Religious days etc.). All requests for exceptional leave of absence must be made in writing to the Headteacher. Request forms are available from the school office.

#### Examples of unauthorised absences

- Holidays
- Days out
- Birthdays
- Parent / carer or sibling unwell
- Tiredness
- No reasonable explanation received from parent / carer

Could parents/carers please ensure that any absence is reported to the school office by 9am.
