#### Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you to everyone who contributed towards the CAFOD Lenten appeal; the school will announce how much was raised in next week's newsletter.

A reminder that parents are invited to Education Child Protection (ECP) Ltd's Online Safety Meeting for Parents/Carers next Wednesday 26th April at 3.45pm in the school hall - the presentation will finish at 4.45pm (a crèche will be available for young children). The presentation will provide parents with an insight into the latest trends of what children are doing online, details of the current 'apps' and games that children are using and playing, and the issues and dangers children face online. This session is a 'must' for all parents whose children have a presence in the digital world. The outcome is to empower parents to keep their children safe when using technology. I urge you all to make the time to attend this meeting.

Parents will be aware that the National Education Union (NEU) announced that teachers would strike over pay in England and Wales on a further two dates; **Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> April and Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> May.** This is the result of a national pay dispute between education unions and the government – it is not due to any actions taken by the school, and it is a matter for the unions and the government to resolve independently of the school. Therefore, school attendance on Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> April and Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> May will be restricted as follows:

- Reception Class OPEN (Reception pupils must attend school Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> April and Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> May as normal)
- Year 1 Class OPEN (Year 1 pupils must attend school Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> April and Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> May as normal)
- Year 2 Class OPEN (Year 2 pupils must attend school Thursday 27th April and Tuesday 2nd May as normal)
- Year 3 Class CLOSED (there will be no school for Year 3 pupils on Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> April and Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> May)
- Year 4 Class CLOSED on Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> April (there will be no school for Year 4 pupils on Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> April)
- Year 4 Class OPEN (Year 4 pupils must attend school Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> May as normal)
- Year 5 Class CLOSED (there will be no school for Year 5 pupils on Thursday 27th April and Tuesday 2nd May)
- Year 6 Class OPEN (Year 6 pupils must attend school Thursday 27th April and Tuesday 2nd May as normal)

Illnesses that will prevent your child from coming to school

- High temperature with a diagnosed infection
- Hospital admission
- Dental surgery
- Medical emergency

Illnesses that will not prevent your child from coming to school

- Mild cough
- Cold/Sneezes
- Tiredness

# Examples of authorised absences

- Proof of illness from GP/Hospital provided
- Phone call from parent / carer explaining that their child is ill
- Proof of medical appointment
- Permission given from Headteacher following a written request for exceptional leave of absence (i.e. Religious days etc.). All requests for exceptional leave of absence must be made in writing to the Headteacher. Request forms are available from the school office.

# The Wednesday Word

A After his resurrection Jesus was seen by his closest friends and over 500 of his followers. Ask your child if they know what the name 'Jesus' means (parent help: the name 'Jesus' in Hebrew means 'God saves'). Jesus came to save us from doing wrong - to show us and to teach us how to live good lives. Does your child have a favourite story about Jesus? What does your child like about Jesus? It may help your child if you tell them something that you know and like about Jesus.

Our lives are enriched when we know Jesus. He is with us at all times and in all places. We can encounter him in prayer and in one another. The more we know about Jesus through reading the gospels, the easier it is for us to recognise him. Knowing and following Jesus helps happiness and love to grow in our families. Perhaps we can: decide to pray each day; read the gospels together; remember to regularly ask ourselves, "What would Jesus do?" and then try to do the same ourselves

# Polio and MMR routine vaccinations for children aged 1 to 11

Polio and MMR (Measles, Mumps and Rubella) vaccinations both provide important protection against serious illness for your child. To keep your child safe, it is important to follow the childhood immunisation vaccination schedule. Children aged 1-11 who are not up to date with their vaccinations are being offered polio and MMR catch-up vaccinations in school or at their registered GP surgeries. The NHS will be contacting the parents of children who are not fully vaccinated to sign a consent form for school-based vaccination.

Check your child's red book or contact your GP to check your child's vaccine status. If your child has missed one of their vaccinations, please contact your GP to book an appointment and get your child up to date.

# Emergency Alerts - National Test 23rd April For Information

The Government's new Emergency Alerts system is now live, enabling people to be contacted through their mobile phone in the event of there being a danger to life near to where they are, for example severe flooding or fire in their area. If that were to happen near you, your mobile phone or tablet will receive an alert with advice about how to stay safe. The Government plans to test the system by sending a national test alarm to all smartphones that use 4G and 5G phone networks, at 3pm on Sunday 23 April 2023.

On that day, compatible mobile phones across the UK will sound the alarm – a siren and vibration, lasting for up to 10 seconds.

The emergency alert will appear on your device's home screen and you will need to acknowledge it before you can use other features on the phone. It will however just be a test, so other than to acknowledge it, you do not need to take any further action.

It's important to note that the alarm will sound even if your phone is on silent. If you're a victim of domestic abuse and you're worried that this could put you or someone you know in danger because they have a hidden phone, or you're concerned for someone else's safety, please watch this video from Refuge to find out how to turn the alert off. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=I2MBcHwmiy8
