Dear Parents and Carers,

The week after half-term, we will be celebrating Walk to School Week. All children are being encouraged to walk, wheel, cycle or scoot to school on Tuesday 6th – Friday 9th June (please remember that the school is closed on Monday 5th June for staff training). It has been proven that children who do some form of exercise, especially a walk before school, do better in class because they arrive refreshed, fit and ready to learn. The school run alone is responsible for generating half a million tonnes of CO2 per year (which is more than some small, countries) – imagine what we could achieve if we began converting some of these car rides into strides?

As part of our Walk to School Week celebration, we are hosting a "Bikers' Breakfast" on Thursday 8th June. Any child who walks, cycles or scoots to school on Thursday can have a free breakfast; breakfast will be served from 8am-8.30am in the school hall.

At 2.30pm on Thursday 8th June, Father John will be coming to celebrate Mass for the school's feast day; parents are very welcome to attend.

A reminder that on Friday 9th June, in preparation for the Friends' Summer Fair and BBQ, we are inviting all the children to come to school in non-school uniform clothes in return for a bottle of drink. The bottle can contain either an alcoholic or non-alcoholic drink.

On Thursday 15th June at 3.45pm in the school hall, we will be holding a meeting for all the current Reception parents. This meeting will give you information about your child's transition into Year 1 in September. Please make the effort to attend this meeting as routines, procedures, curriculum content and the learning environment in Y1 are very different to the provision in Reception. Your child's time in the EYFS is coming to an end and it is important for you to understand how different the teaching and learning in Key Stage 1 (Year1 and Year 2) will be. A crêche will be available during the meeting should you wish to use it; if your child does stay in the hall for the duration of the meeting please ensure they remain seated and quiet.

I would like to extend my sincere thanks to the Friends for the super new Reception class sandpit – we are just waiting for the sand to be delivered but I am sure it is going to be a very popular choice of activity for our youngest pupils.

Why did Jesus breathe on the disciples? This coming Sunday the Church c celebrates Pentecost. This is the feast of the gift of the Holy Spirit to the Church – a gift which we now receive at Baptism, Confirmation and at Mass. Ask your child what they know about Pentecost. It may help your child if you tell them something that you know about Pentecost. The word 'Pentecost' means 'fiftieth day'. On this day (fifty days after Easter) the apostles were filled with the Holy Spirit.
