Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you to all the parents/carers who attended the class curriculum meetings; we hope you found them useful. A reminder that the Year 2 meeting was rescheduled for this Monday (25th September) at 2.30pm.

On Tuesday 10th October at 3.45pm in the hall we will be holding a parents' meeting around the teaching of phonics. In June 2024, all Year 1 children will be taking the national Year 1 Phonic Screening Test – the results of which will go home to parents at the end of the Summer term. We will be talking to parents about how best to help children at home and the expectations of children's phonic knowledge by the end of Reception, Year 1 and Y2. **This meeting is for Reception and Y1 parents and I strongly encourage you to make the time to attend this meeting.** A crêche will be available for the younger children if you wish to use it. If your child stays in the meeting, it remains the responsibility of the parents to ensure your child remains seated and quiet.

On Wednesday, all pupils in Y3/Y4/Y5/Y6 received a letter with information about the *Mini Vinnies*. As a result of last year's Year 6 pupils moving onto secondary school, we now have some spaces for new Mini Vinnies. If your child would like to become a Mini Vinnie, they will need to write a letter of application addressed to myself. In the letter, your child will need to state why they believe they would make a good Mini Vinnie. All letters must be submitted by Friday 29th September 3.30pm; we will choose four new children to join the St. Theresa's Mini Vinnie group – the four successful applicants will be told on Monday 9th October.

A reminder to everybody that it is the Macmillan Coffee Morning next Friday. All parents/carers are warmly invited to come and have tea/coffee and cake in the multi-purpose room from 8.30-9.30am. The children will also be given a cake and squash and we ask them to kindly bring in a donation of £1.

Year 6 Secondary Transfer Information

The online application system for our Year 6 parents is now open at www.eadmissions.org.uk

All parents must apply online. If you need support please feel free to contact the school for support, or call the School Admissions Customer Services Team on 020 8359 7651

Parents of children in Y6 who have an Educational Health Care Plan will need to complete a different form – this will have been sent to you by the Barnet SEN team.

The deadline for submitting your application is Monday $31^{\rm st}$ October 2023. Applications received after $31^{\rm st}$ October will be treated as late. Late applications will not be considered until after the on-time applicants have been allocated their school places. This means that late applicants are unlikely to be offered one of their preferred schools. If there is a good reason as to why your application is late; for example you moved to the area after the closing date, you must contact the admissions department by $12^{\rm th}$ December 2023 at the latest.
