### Dear Parents and Carers,

- The Importance of Good Attendance and School Procedures. Please read this very carefully as leave of absence during term time will be granted only in exceptional circumstances. If you take unauthorized leave, you may be issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice of up to £120 per parent, per child
- School opening times and punctuality information
- Spelling lists for Y1-Y6 (these are spellings the children must learn off by heart)
- Packed lunch guidelines for parents who provide their child with a packed lunch every day.

#### Please read all the information very carefully!

Over the next couple of weeks, parents are invited to attend class curriculum meetings at the school. At the meetings, the class teacher will explain routines, talk about what the children will be learning, expectations for the year group and ways you can help at home. #### Drop off and Pick Up routines

In the morning, to drop off your child, please walk down the pedestrian path in the car-park, turn left into the playground and wait in the playground until the school bell rings. When the school bell rings at 8.40am, walk around the school building until you get to the correct classroom. The doors to the classrooms will open at 8.40am. Once you have dropped your child off, please leave the premises the same way you entered.

It is the same procedure for the afternoon pick-up. All children are dismissed from their classrooms at the end of the day. The class teacher will stand at the door and when they see you, they will allow your child to leave.

The side gate (to the right of the school office) will no longer be opened or used as part of the drop off /pick up routines.

#### Year 6 Secondary Transfer Information

#### The Wednesday Word

"Let us all become people of reconciliation and peace!" *Pope Francis* What does Jesus say is the first thing that we should do if someone u upsets us? Sometimes we make mistakes and occasionally upset one another. The important thing is to overcome such upsets in a loving way and become friends again. This is also known as reconciliation. This Sunday's Gospel suggests ways of doing this peacefully and calmly. Ask your child who have been their special friends over the years, even if they have had misunderstandings. Tell your children about the special friendships you have had over the years. Each say what you think makes a lasting friendship?

#### "Do I take the Gospel message of reconciliation and love into the places where I live and work?" *Pope Francis*

In the Gospel, Jesus teaches us that we should always try hard to be reconciled – to heal relationships and to try to make friends again. Prayer is an important part of reconciliation. We can ask Jesus, anytime, to bring peace to a situation, and to guide us back to friendship. We can't always undo mistakes if we have done something wrong and upset someone, but we can always learn from our mistakes and try to make amends. As a family, share ideas about how to be reconciled with someone if things go wrong. Perhaps we can; say sorry if we have done wrong; ask an adult to help us make friends again. Can you think of other ways?

All parents must apply online. If you need support please feel free to contact the school for support, or call the School Admissions Customer Services Team on 020 8359 7651.

Parents of children in Y6 who have an Educational Health Care Plan will need to complete a different form – this will have been sent to you by the Barnet SEN team.

The deadline for submitting your application is Monday 31<sup>st</sup> October 2023. Applications received after 31<sup>st</sup> October will be treated as late. Late applications will not be considered until after the on-time applicants have been allocated their school places. This means that late applicants are unlikely to be offered one of their preferred schools. If there is a good reason as to why your application is late; for example you moved to the area after the closing date, you must contact the admissions department by 12<sup>th</sup> December 2023 at the latest.
