#### Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you to everybody who supported last week's Macmillan's Coffee Morning; the school raised a huge £438! We are very grateful for everyone's help.

A reminder that next Tuesday (10th October) at 3.45pm in the hall, we will be holding a parents' meeting around the teaching of phonics. In June 2024, all Year 1 children will be taking the national Year 1 Phonic Screening Test – the results of which will go home to parents at the end of the Summer term. We will be talking to parents about how best to help children at home and the expectations of children's phonic knowledge by the end of Reception, Year 1 and Y2. This meeting is for Reception and Y1 parents and I strongly encourage you to make the time to attend this meeting. A crêche will be available for the younger children if you wish to use it. If your child stays in the meeting, it remains the responsibility of the parents to ensure your child remains seated and quiet.

Thank you to Mrs Decuseara who has been successful in applying, on behalf of St. Theresa's, for the Gold Travel Plan! This award is issued by Transport for London and in order to apply, the school had to complete a range of different travel activities - all with the aim of engaging the school community in reducing the number of journeys made by car every

This week the Year 6 pupils were at Grosvenor Hall in Kent for their 5 day residential trip; judging by the photos posted by the staff onto Seesaw, they have had a great time. We are looking forward to seeing them back at school, next week. #### Year 6 Secondary Transfer Information

The online application system for our Year 6 parents is now open at <a href="https://www.eadmissions.org.uk">www.eadmissions.org.uk</a>

All parents must apply online. If you need support please feel free to contact the school for support, or call the School Admissions Customer Services Team on 020 8359 7651.

Parents of children in Y6 who have an Educational Health Care Plan will need to complete a different form – this will have been sent to you by the Barnet SEN team.

The deadline for submitting your application is Monday 31st October 2023. Applications received after 31st October will be treated as late. Late applications will not be considered until after the on-time applicants have been allocated their school places. This means that late applicants are unlikely to be offered one of their preferred schools. If there is a good reason as to why your application is late; for example you moved to the area after the closing date, you must contact the admissions department by 12th December 2023 at the latest.
