# Dear Parents and Carers,

This week was Anti-Bullying Week and the theme was "Make a Noise About Bullying". As part of this year's Anti-Bullying Week campaign, everyone was asked to think about what we mean by 'banter', the role 'banter' plays in bullying and how we can tackle it. We know that the term 'banter' can be misused to disguise bullying behaviours. Banter is defined as 'the playful and friendly exchange of teasing remarks'. However, sometimes these behaviours can be taken too far such that the behaviours constitute bullying. For example, when there is targeted repetition of the 'banter' or if the 'banter' is about personal characteristics such as appearance. The significance of behaviours that we would think of as bullying can also be downplayed when people try to pass these behaviours off as 'just banter'. We are not saying that we cannot joke with friends, but we are encouraging everyone to be mindful of how, sometimes, these jokes may not be received as they were intended.

Can I please remind all parents to note that teachers are in class during the day and are therefore unlikely to be logged onto Seesaw. If you have general queries about school, or a message about pick-up arrangements etc. please contact the school office. If you do leave a message for the teacher regarding homework etc., the teachers will aim to respond as soon as they can, within normal office hours.

Over the past couple of months, the children in Y1-Y6 have been having weekly dance lessons with the Non-Stop Action dance teachers. Each class has been practising a choreographed routine and will be performing it to the rest of the school next Friday (24<sup>th</sup> November) at 9am. All parents are warmly invited to attend this Dance Festival. The best routine will go on to represent St. Theresa's at the Barnet Schools' Dance Festival in March; I hope to see

#### Message from Public Health Barnet

MMR vaccine rates are still worringly low in Barnet. Protect your children against measles and prevent disruption to school attendance.

Measles is a viral illness that can be serious and sometimes fatal. Cases of measles are rising in London, and with around 75% of 5-year-olds fully vaccinated in Barnet, we are well below the World Health Organisations target of 95% needed to prevent an outbreak.

Symptoms of measles include high fever, runny nose, cough, red and watery eyes, small red spots with a bluish-white centre inside the mouth. A rash can appear later, usually on the face, upper neck, hands and feet, fading after 5 to 6 days.

Vaccination can help prevent outbreaks and protect against serious illness. Any child identified as a close contact of a measles case without satisfactory vaccination status may be asked to self-isolate for up to 21 days.
