Dear Parents and Carers,

Last Friday, the children in Y4, Y5 and Y6 were lucky enough to have a visit from the Metropolitan Police; the police office spoke to all the children about the Rule of Law. The police explained the importance of having rules in society and what the consequences are if members of the public break those rules.

During the week beginning Monday 5th February, St. Theresa's will be celebrating Children's Mental Health Week. This year's theme is *My Voice Matters*. *My Voice Matters* is about empowering children and young people by providing them with the tools they need to express themselves. When we feel empowered, there's a positive impact on our wellbeing. Children who feel that their voices are heard and can make a difference have a greater sense of community and self-esteem. This year, we want children of all ages, backgrounds and abilities to be empowered to work together to create a positive change for their mental health and wellbeing.

That week will also be host to Safer Internet Day (Tuesday 6th February) and all the pupils will be involved in online safety activities. This year's theme is "Inspiring Change? Making a difference, managing influence and navigating change online". Safer Internet Day is the UK's biggest celebration of online safety. Each year, an online issue or theme that speaks to the things young people are seeing and experiencing online, is covered. Created in consultation with young people across the UK, this year Safer Internet Day will be focusing on change online, this includes covering:

- Young people's perspective on new and emerging technology.
- Using the internet to make change for the better
- The changes young people want to see online
- The things that can influence and change the way young people think, feel and act online and offline.

Jesus' personal example, the witness of his life, gave power and authority to his teaching. Jesus practised what he taught and we should try to do the same. Ask your child what the word 'teacher' means to them. Ask them which people teach them about God – at home, at school or in the community. What have they recently been taught about God? Who is their favourite teacher, and why? Perhaps you can tell your child about a person you know who is, or was, a good teacher, and say why.

Each of you choose someone who teaches you good and right things, and say a prayer for them. How can we show our appreciation to all those who teach us at home, school or in the community?
