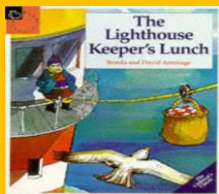


In Literacy we will be learning about:

- At the beginning of the half term we will be reading "The Snail and the Whale" by Julia Donaldson. This lovely story will lead us to write our own story about two different creatures who go on a big adventure together. Next, we might write a newspaper report about the people (and the snail) who saved the whale.
- In the middle of the half term we will be reading 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch' by Ronda and David Armitage. This dilemma story will provide us with lots of rich opportunities for drama and writing in role.



In Science "Move it", we will be learning:

- How different objects move.
- Comparing and testing rockets, flying fish, and marshmallow rockets.
- Changing the shapes of objects.
- Comparing how things move, changing objects so that they move in different ways and at different distances.

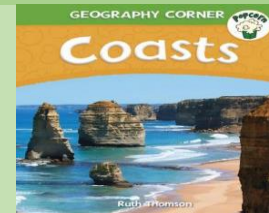
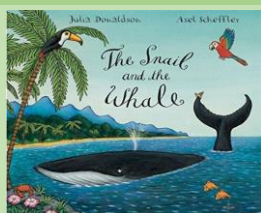
In our R.E topic 'A Sacramental People' we will be:

- Recognising, describing or explaining that people act in particular ways because of their faith.
- Recognising, describing or explaining the signs, symbols, words and actions of the Sacrament of Healing.
- Explaining how religious belief shapes life.

In Computing we will be finding out about programming and we will:

- Begin to understand that sequences of commands have an outcome, and make predictions based on our learning.
- Use and modify designs to create our own quiz questions in Scratch Jr
- Evaluate our work and make improvements to our programming projects.

Year 2 Summer 2 Term Topic: Coastline



In REHC we will:

- Through the story, children will be introduced to the concept of the Holy Trinity and think about what the Holy Trinity means for us.
- Through the story of The Good Samaritan, children will learn who their neighbour is – everyone! They will have an opportunity to reflect on what this means for us and our communities.
- Learn about the different communities that we are part of, both local and global.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION:

NSA will be teaching the class to develop skills in outdoor athletics • Develop running with good posture • Jump quickly from side to side • Explore combining hops and jumps in a sequence • Run along a curve with control • Accelerate quickly in a sprint relay • Jump from one foot to two feet.

In our Mathematics learning the class will be looking at:

- Fraction
- Time
- Statistics
- Position and direction
- Continuing to add and subtract numbers up to 100.
- Continuing to learn our 2, 3, 5 and 10 times tables.



In History and Geography, we will be:

- finding out about British seas and beaches.
- using fieldwork skills to find out about a place.
- comparing a British beach with one from another country.
- using compass points to move around a map.
- Identify the similarities and differences between seaside holidays now and in the past



In our Art and Design, we will:

- Use the tale of Goldilocks and the Three Bears as inspiration to help Baby Bear by making him a brand-new chair.
- Design the chair, considering Baby Bear's needs and what he likes
- Explore ways of building the chair so that it is strong.
