Dear Parents and Carers.

This morning, all Y1-Y6 parents/carers should have received the link to the Parent Consultations booking system. If you did not receive the link - or are not able to access the online booking system - please contact the school office and we will make an appointment for you. Please note that the online booking system for the first consultation evening (Thursday 6th February) will close on Friday 31stJanuary at 6pm. After this time, any further appointments for Thursday 6th February will need to be made via the school office. The online booking system for the second evening will remain open for a while longer. Parents/carers will be meeting and talking to their child's class teacher in the hall, but will also be able to look at their child's books in their child's classroom. Nursery and Reception consultations will be arranged for later in the term.

I would like to remind all parents of the link between poor attendance at school, and lower academic achievement.

- In 2018/19, just 40% of persistently absent children in KS2 achieved expected KS2 standards, compared with 84% of pupils who were regular attenders. Any child whose attendance is below 90% is considered a persistent absentee.
- And 36% of persistently absent children in KS4 got 9 to 4 in their English and maths GCSEs, compared with 84% of regular attenders.

And it's never too late to benefit from good attendance:

 More than half (54%) of pupils who were persistently absent in Year 10 and then rarely absent in Year 11, passed at least 5 GCSEs, compared to 36% of pupils who were persistently absent in both years.


But attendance is important for more than just attainment:

 Regular school attendance can facilitate positive peer relationships, which is a protective factor for mental health and wellbeina.

Please be aware that the Barnet Educational Welfare Officer visits the school every half-term and monitors all children's attendance. **Children are expected to attend at least 96% of the school year**; any child whose attendance falls below 96% may be highlighted as a possible concern. Any child whose attendance falls below 90% is considered a persistent absentee and may trigger formal monitoring from the Educational Welfare Officer
