Who Was St David?

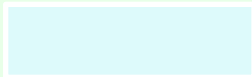


A Special Saint

St David (or **Dewi Sant**) is the patron saint of Wales.

The Welsh Flag

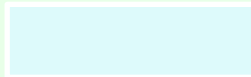
